

5th The Town by their Vote, Voted to Repair their High Ways by a Rate the present Year, and Ordered their Surveyors to be Collectors and Granted the Sum of One Hundred and fifty pounds for Repairing the same . . . 150 . . .

Then the Town by their Vote Adjourned their Meeting to Next Monday at one o'Clock in the After Noone to this place.

March 25th 1771 The Town being met at time and place according to the aforesaid Adjournment and proceeded As follows viz^t

6th The Town by their Vote accepted of the Settlement of the Select Men with their Town Treasurer John Maynard

7th This Article was put to Vote and pass'd in the Negative

8th The Town by their Vote, Voted to choose three Men to settle the Town Debt, agreeable to this Article and by their Vote chose three Men for the Business aforesaid - viz^t Mr John Tilton Mr Thomas Sympton and Mr John Maynard

9th This Article was put to Vote and pass'd in the Negative

10th This Article was put to Vote and pass'd in the Negative

11th This Article was put to Vote and pass'd in the Affirmative

12th This Article was put to Vote and pass'd in the Negative

13th This Article was put to Vote and pass'd in the Affirmative

14th This Article was put to Vote and pass'd in the Negative

15th It was put to Vote to See if the Town will put by this Article to May Meeting and not Act upon it at this time and it pass'd in the Affirmative
