

- 1st To Choose Select Men, Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Apepore, Con-
Stables, and all other Town Officers, as the Law Direct to be Chosen
Annually in the Month of March
- 2^d To See if the Town will give liberty for Horses, to go at large,
without Tethers, any part of the time, from the first of April Next
to the last of September, the present year
- 3^d To See if the Town will give liberty for Sheep to go at large, in
Said Town, any part of the time, from the fifteenth Day of March
Next to the first Day of May Next
- 4th To See if the Town will give liberty, for the Swine, to go at large
in Said Town, the present year
- 5th To See if the Town will repair, their High Ways, by a Rate the present
year, and grant a suitable sum of Money for repairing the same
and empower the Surveyors, to be Collectors of said Rate, also Order
the Apepore to make it into a Rate forthwith.
- 6th To See if the Town will Accept of the Settlement of the Select Men
with the present Town Treasurer William Baldwin.
- 7th To See if the Town will Choose a Committee and empower them to
Settle the Town Debt, before Debt and Credit Meeting, and lay
the Account before the Town for their Acceptance
- 8th To See if the Town will allow Mr John Balcom and others to set up
a Small House near the West Meeting House in Sudbury, on the Towns
land for to repair to on Sabbath Day
- 9th To See if the Town will Accept of a High Way laid out by the Select
Men, at the Request of Timothy James, as may fully appear by the
minutes of said Way, and Order the same to be recorded.
- 10th To See if the Town for the future will Build and keep in repair
the several School Houses in Said Town, and make proper Allowance
for such as are already Built, or do or act any other way as the
Town shall think proper when met
- 11th To See if the Town will Accept of the Select Mens report with re-
gard to the standing of the Reading and Writing School Houses
in said Town
- 12th To See if the Town will Rebuild or enlarge the West Meeting
House in said Town, Agreeable to the Petitions of Deacon Jacob
Moore and John Maynard and others
- 13th To See if the Town will Order their Powder House to be set, as
near the Centre of Said Town, on the west side of the River, as can
be with conveniently agreeable to a Petition of Capl Ezekiel Stou-
and Others
- 14th To See if the Town will procure, two new Bunging Coths, for
the Use of the Town, on both sides the River, and appropriate
a suitable sum of Money to pay for the same, out of the Town
Securities
- 15th To See if the Town, by their Vote, will Order a penalty of
three Shillings lawfull Money, to be paid by the Owner or Owners
of any Ram or Rams, that shall be found running at large
any
