

X any time from the tenth Day of August Next to the twenty fifth Day of October yearly; the finder to give Notice thereof by posting up said Ram or Rams with their or their marks Natural and Artificial, in some publick place in said Town and if no owner appear, within six Days, then said Ram or Rams to be forfitted to the finder — also Order it to be presented to the Justices of General Sessions of the Peace for the County of Middlesex for their Acceptance and confirmation

16th To See if the Town, will discontinue a two Rod High Way, lying between the Lands of Deacon Stephen Gibson and Leptanah Smith and dispose of the same, as the Town shall think proper when met

17th To See if the Town will accept of the List of Jurors as they are put into the Box by the Select Men
And make due Return of this Order with your doings thereon at a time and place above mentioned.

By Order of the Select Men

In Observance of the above Order I have warned all the Freeholders and other Inhabitants belonging to the Town of Sudbury (in my Ward) Qualified to Vote in Town Affairs, to meet at time and place above mentioned
Phineas Gleyzer Constable for Sudbury

The Return of the other three Constables Orders were as the Law Direct and were accepted by the Town

At a Town Meeting in Sudbury legally Warned the 2^d Day of March 1772. — The Town being met at time and place, proceeded and chose John Noyes Esq^r Moderator, then the Town chose their Town Officers as follows viz^t
