1st To Elect and depute one or more Person or Persons, being Freeholders
and resident in said Town, to serve for and Represent said Town
at a Great and General Court or Assembly, Appointed to be convened
held and kept, for his Majesty's Service at Harvard College in
Cambridge on Wednesday, the twenty Seventh Day of May Inst at
Nine o'Clock in the fore Noon, and so de die in Diem during their
Session and Sessions, as is directed in said precept, sent to said Town

2^d To See if the Town, for the future will allow the Constables the for
stable, Six pence on the pound for Collecting, the Province Town
and County Taxes, Agreeable to the Petition of Cap^t Isaac Catting &
others, or do or Act any other Ways as the Town shall think pro-
per when met

3^d To See if the Town will Receive the report of their Committee
for enlarging the West Meeting House

4th To See if the Town will Order the Remainder of the Salary
granted to pay the Rev^d Mr Israel Loring Deced^d, to be
applied for supplying the Pulpit the west side the River

5th To See if the Town will allow the Funeral Charges of the Rev^d
Mr Israel Loring, and Grant or appropriate a Suitable sum
of money to pay the same

to the Select Men or Town Clerk at time and place above
mentioned

Sudbury May 6th 1772

At a Town Meeting in Sudbury legally Warned May 19th 1772
the Town being met at time and place, proceeded and chose
John Noyes Esq^r: being a Freeholder and resident in said Town
to serve for and represent them in a Great and General Court
to be convened, held and kept at Harvard College in Cambridge
at said Meeting May 19th 1772 the Town proceeded and chose John
Noyes Esq^r: Moderator

2^d The Town Voted to allow the Constables for the future three
pence on the pound for Collecting the Province Town & County
Taxes

3^d The Town Voted to receive the report of the Committee and not
enlarge the Meeting House for the present
