- 8th The Town by their Voted, Granted the sum of two Hundred pounds for Mr Jacob Biglow, his Settlement and Seventy four pounds a year, for his Salary as he has contracted for, with the West Parish in Sudbury Also the improvement of the Ministerial lands belonging to said Parish - 274 - -
- 9th The Town Voted to Choose a Committee to meet Framingham Committee to settle William Duns Action and Chose for their Committee Mess^{rs} Wm Baldwin Thomas Plympton & Joseph Curtis and fully impowred them to make a final Settlement on D^s Affair
- 10th Article passed in the Negative
- 11th The Town by their Vote Chose a Committee to Build and repair their School Houses in said Town and Chose for their Committee At Elisha Wheeler Mr John Meriam and Mr John Balcom also Voted that said Committee should give Notice and let them out by the Year, if any should appear to Build or repair them, the Undertakers to wait untill next October Meeting for their pay and to Build them twenty feet square
