

To Mr Jonas Holden One of the Constables of Sudbury - Greeting

These Order you to Warn all the Freeholders and other Inhabitants off & Belonging to Sudbury (in your Ward) Qualified to Vote in Town affairs and in the Chouse of Representatives to meet at the West Meeting House in Sudbury on Monday the Seventeenth Day of May Instant at two o'clock P.M. on said Day

1st To Elect and Depute one or more Person or Persons being Freeholders and Resident in said Town, at a Great and General Court or Assembly appointed to be convened, held and kept, for his Majestys Service, at the Court House in Boston, on Wednesday the twenty sixth Day of May Instant, at Nine of the Clock in the fore Noon, and so to Lie in Diem During their Session and Sessions as is Directed in a Precept sent to said Town

2^d To see if the Town will do any thing to suppress a certain Club of Men, that the Petitioners shall Name, who make it, their whole Business to trade with and Cheat Strangers and other Persons, also to see what the Town will do to suppress all those, that try to encourage those vile Practices, by Buying those Goods which they must know are Got in a clandestine way and manner by exposing those Persons Names in the Publick Prints or otherways or do or act any otherways as the Town shall think proper where met agreeable to a Petition of Capt Wood and others

3^d To see if the Town will move the Powder House to some suitable place and Repair the same and Order the Town Stock of Ammunition to be removed thereto, or do or act as the Town shall think proper when met

4th To see if the Town will Order the Rate Bill for making the new Way from Mr Bridges to the East Meeting House, which was committed to Mr Lebadiah Allen, to be committed to some suitable Person and empower him to Collect the same

And make due Return of this Order with your doings thereon to the Select Men or Town Clerk at time and place forementioned

The Return of the other three Constables Orders were as the Law Directs and were accepted by the Town

At a Town Meeting in Sudbury Legally Warned May 17th 1773 the Town being met at time and place provided and Voted to send a Representative (and Brought in their Votes, after Polling twice there appeared to be no Vote - Then the Town adjourned their Meeting to the Next Day at one o'clock P.M. The Town being met according to the aforesaid adjournment proceeded and Chose Deacon Thomas Rappaport being a Freeholder and Resident in said Town to serve for and represent them in a Great and General Court, to be convened held and kept for his Ma
