- These order you to Warn all the Freeholders and other Inhabitants off, and Belonging to Sudbury (in your Ward) Qualified to Vote in Town Affairs to meet at the East Meeting House in Sudbury on Monday the twenty fifth Day of October instant at one of the Clock in the After Noon on said Day then and there
- 1st To Bring in Town Debts and Credit
 - 2^d To See if the Town will Grant their Read Ministers, their Salary for the Year ensuing
 - 3^d To See if the Town will Grant money for the Support of the Grammar School and Order where said School shall be kept the ensuing year
 - 4th To See if the Town will Grant Money for the Support of a Reading and Writing School, and Order where said School shall be kept the ensuing year
 - 5th To See if the Town will Grant money for the Relief of the Poor, in said Town, the present Year
