

To Mr Asher Cutler one of the Constables of Sudbury Greeting

These Order you to Warn all the Freeholders and other Inhabitants off and belonging to Sudbury, in your Ward, Qualified as the Law Direct to Vote in Town Affairs, to meet at the last Meeting House in Sudbury on Monday the sixth Day of March Next at ten of the Clock in the fore Noon on said Day, there and there

1st To choose Select Men, Town Clerk, Town Treas: Assessors, Constables and all other Town Officers, as the Law Direct to be chosen Annually in the Month of March

2^d To See if the Town will give liberty for Horses to go at large without fetters any part of the Time, from the first of April Next to the last Day of September the present Year

3^d To See if the Town will give liberty for Sheep to go at large, in said Town any part of the Time, from the fifteenth Day of March Next to the first Day of May Next

4th To See if the Town will give liberty for the swine to go at large, in said Town, the present Year

5th To See if the Town will Repair their High Ways, by a Rate the present Year and Grant a Suitable sum of Money for repairing the same, and Impower the surveyors to be Collectors of said Rates, also Order the Assessors to make into a Rate forthwith

6th To See if the Town will Accept of the Settlement of the Select Men with their present Town Treas: W^m Baldwin

7th To See if the Town will for the future, warn their Town Meetings by posting up Notifications at each of the Meeting Houses in said Town or do or Act any other way as the Town shall think proper when met agreeable to the Petition of Joatham Brown and others

8th To See if the Town will pay Col Noyes for the land where the Town Road goes, near Timothy Shermans or Discontinue said Road agreeable to said Noyes, Petition

9th To See if the Town will Accept of the List of Jurors as put into the Box by the Select Men

10th To See if the Town what encouragement the Town will Give to their minute Men, when they are properly enlisted according to the advice of the Provincial Congress, and do or Act any other way, as the Town shall think proper when met

11th To See if the Town will Accept of a High Way from Lieut Francis Whelen land to Concord Line, as laid out by the Select Men, he being at the Cost of making and keeping in Repair said Way forever

And make due Return of this Order with your doings thereon to the Select Men, or Town Clerk at time and Place above mentioned
