5th The Town Voted to repair
the High ways by a Rate the
present year and Granted the sum
of one Hundred ^{pounds} to repair the
same, also empowered the Sur-
veyors to be Collectors of said
Rate and Ordered the ~~Commissioner~~
to make it into a Rate forthwith

6th The Town Accepted of the settle-
ment the Select Men had made
with the Town Treasurer ~~Wm~~ in

7th Voted that the Town Meetings
for the present year shall be
warned by Notifications, posted
up at each of the Meeting Houses
in said Town

8th Voted to Discontinue the high
way mentioned in this Article
if said Noyes find a suitable
way to accommodate the publick
that shall be to the satisfaction
of the Select Men

9th The Town Accepted of the
List of Jurors

10th Voted that the Town will pay
each of their Minute Men one
Shilling and six pence for training
one half day in a Week (four Halves
to be esteemed half a Day) after they
are properly instructed and returned
according to the advice of the Provinci-
al Congress, untill they are called
into actual Service or Dismissed
Also Voted to pay the Captains of
the Minute Men for exercising their
Companies half a Day in a Week ^{three Shillings} three
the Lieutenants two Shillings & six
pence & the Ensigns two Shillings un-
till they are called into actual Service
or Dismissed
