These Order you to warn all the Freeholders and other Inhabitants of and belonging
 Sudbury (in your ward) Qualified as the Law directs to vote in Town affairs to meet at the
 East Meeting House in Sudbury on Monday the fifth Day of January next at Ele-
 ven o^l Clock before noon. On Said Day: first to Choose a Moderator and ~~then~~
 to instruct their Representative Relating to the Articles of Confederation and per-
 petual union of the United States of America. Agreeable to a Resolve of General
 Court of this State. Make Due Returne of this Order with your Doings thereon
 to the Select men or Town Clerk at time and place above mentioned

 in my ward to meet at time and place as within directed

The Returne of the other three Constables were according to Law and were accept-
 ed by the Town

At a Legal Town Meeting in Sudbury Jan^y 5th 1778

The Town being met at time and place according to the above warning provided
 and Chose Capt Jonathan Rice Moderator. Then the articles of Confederation
 and perpetual union were Read. And the following Gentlemen were Chosen
 a Committee to Draft Instructions for their Representative Relating to Said artic-
 les viz m^r John Maynard Capt Richard Heard Capt Elijah Smith m^r John
 Meriam and Capt Asahel Wheeler. Then the Town Adjourned for one Hour
 to the Same place

The Town being met again the Committee Reported the following Instruct-
 ions for their Representative which was accepted by a unanimous vote of
 the Town viz

Whereas the Honourable Congress have formed and proposed to the Legis-
 lative Body of this State of the Massachusetts Bay Articles of Confederation
 and perpetual union between the United States of America: The Legislative
 Authority of Said State, have Sent the articles to the Town of Sudbury
 The Said Town at a Legal Meeting January 5th 1778 Voted unanemously
 that they approved of the Measures that was adopted by Congress. And also
 Instructed their Representative to Conforme to the Same
