These Order you to warn all the Freeholders and other Inhabitants of said belong-
ing to Sudbury (in your ward) Qualified as the Law directs to vote in Town
Affairs, to meet at the West meeting House on Monday the Second Day of March
Next at twelve o' Clock at noon. on Said Day then and there

- 1st To Choose a moderator
- 2nd To Choose Selectmen, Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Assessor, Constables, and
all other officers as the Law directs to be Chosen annually in the month of March
- 3rd To See if the Town will Give Liberty for Horses to go at Large without fetter
any part of the time from the first Day of April next, to the Last Day of
September the present year
- 4th To See if the Town will Give Liberty for Sheep to go at Large in said Town any
part of the time, from the fifteenth Day of March next, to the first Day
of May next
- 5th To See if the Town will Give Liberty for Swine to go at Large in said Town
the present year
- 6th To See if the Town will Repair their Highways by a Rate the present year, and
Grant a Suitable Sum of Money for Repairing the Same, and Order the
Assessors to make it into a Rate forthwith. Also empower the Surveyors of
Highways to be Collectors of Said Rates
- 7th To See if the Town will accept of the Settlement of the Selectmen with their
present Treasurer James Thompson
- 8th To See if the Town will accept of the List of Jurors, as put into the Box by the
Selectmen
- 9th To See if the Town will Build a School House in the South^{west} Quarter of the Town
in the place agreed upon by said Quarter. Agreeable to the Petition of m^r David
How and others
- 10th To See if the Town will Comply with the Request of En^s Josiah Richardson
to Discontinue a Town way Laid out through his Inclosures over the Mill Brook
or pinners wash, from being an open way, and Give it a Bridle or Curbed
way, or Do or act as the Town think proper when met
- 11th To See if the Town will Comply with the Request of m^r Jonathan Puffer of Stow to
free him from paying Rates in Sudbury, on Condition, that he will keep the
Carriway and Bridge over Honey gut Brook (from Stow Line to the East End
of said Carriway) in good Repair for the space of ten years
- 12th To hear the Report of the Committee Chosen at the Last Town meeting, to
bring to the Town an account of ^{the Services of} each person in Sudbury in the present war
and the Sumes of money that they shall Receive for the Same, and Grant m^o to
pay said persons: And order the Assessors to make it into a Rate forthwith
- 13th To See if the Town will Choose a Committee to hie the men to make up this Towns
Deficiency of their Quota in the Continental army, and Grant money for to hie
the Same. or do or act relating to this article as the Town shall think proper when
met
