At a Legall Town meeting in Sudbury March 2 1778

The Town being met at time and place according to foregoing warning, proceeded and chose Cap^t Jonathan Rice Moderator. Then the Town passed over to the 13th Article, and chose the following Gentlemen a Committee to hie^r Eighteen men on the best terms they can, to make up this Towns Quota of the Continental army viz^t Cap^t Joseph Pierson, Cap^t Jonathan Rice, & Cap^t Rich^d Heard. Then the Town dismissed this article for this time. and proceeded to choose the following Town officers viz^t
