

At a Legall Town Meeting in Sudbury October 19th 1778.

The Town being met at time and place according to the foregoing warning proceeded and chose Mr John Maynard Moderator then the Town by their vote passed over to the 2^d article and

2^d Granted to their Prev^d Ministers for their Salary for the Ensuing Year the Sum of 148 0 0
and also Granted as a Gratuity to each of their Prev^d Ministers for the Ensuing year the Sum of 326 0 0

8^m Then the Town by their vote passed over to the Eighth article
And their Committee Reported as follows

The Committee appointed by the Town of Sudbury at a Legall meeting in June 1778 to Estimate the Services of the Several Inhabitants of Said Town in the present war with Great Britain from the 19th of April 1775 to the present time (and in order that the Burthen may be made Equil upon the Inhabitants of Said Town) Report as follows viz^t

That those persons who have hired men to performe any of the above Services at a time when there was an actual Levy for men, be allowed for Said Services as if performed in person. That those that paid fines or advanced money for the Good of the Service, be allowed in the same proportion as their money would procure Men to performe the Services which at that time they Neglected to do in person. That no person shall be intitled to Receive pay for any of the above Services Unless he shall be first Taxed toward the payment thereof. Also that Each person shall Receive pay only for the time he was in actual Service
