These are to Notify and warn all the Freeholders and other Inhabitants of and belonging to Sudbury Qualified as the Law directs to vote in Town affairs to meet at the West meeting House in Sudbury, on Monday the first Day of February next Ensuing at one of the Clock after noon on Said Day then and there

- 1st To Chooe a Moderator, and see if the Town will vote for a Division of Said Town, and agree on a Line for a Division, so that we may be Incorporated into two Distinct Towns, or act on Said affair as the Town shall think proper when met
 - 2^d To see if the Town will Grant to Several persons (who were not allowed for their Services in the present war at the Last Town meeting) the Sumes that others were allowed at Said meeting for the same Services
 - 3^d To see what pay the Town will allow to the Constables for collecting the Average Rate

This Notification has been posted up at Each meeting House in Sudbury agreeable to the vote of Said Town By Order of the Selectmen James Thompson Town Clerk

The Town by their vote accepted of the warning of this meeting, and proceeded to the work of the Day as follows

At a Legall Town Meeting in Sudbury Feb^y 1st 1779

The Town being met at Time and place according to the foregoing warning, proceeded, and Elise Coli Ezeheel How Moderator, and took the first article under Consideration, and appointed Maj^r Joseph Curtis Tho^s Plympton Esq^r m^r John Balcorn Capt Richard Heard and Cap^t Jon^a Rice a Committee to agree on a Line for a Division of the Town

- 2^d Then the Town by their vote Submitted the Consideration of the Second article to the Committee appointed at a former Town Meeting to Adjust the Clames of Each person in Sudbury to allowances for their Services in the present war

- 3^d Voted to allow to the Constables one penny half penny on the pound for Collecting the average Rate

The Committee Returned that was appointed to agree on a Line for Dividing the Town and informed the Town that they could not agree

Voted to Adjourn this meeting to a future Day, to Consider further on the first Article

The Committee that the Second article was Submitted to presented to the Town a List of the following persons, to be allowed for their Services in the present war, the Sumes Set to their Respective Names, and the Town Granted to Each of them the Sumes following viz^t
