- These are to notify and warn all the freeholders and other Inhabitants of and belonging to Sudbury Qualified as the Law Directs to vote in Town affairs and in the Choice of Representatives, to meet at the West Meeting-House in Sudbury, on Monday the Seventeenth Day of May instant, at one o' Clock after noon on Said Day then and there
- 1st To Choose one or more persons, ^{being freeholders and Resident in this Town} to serve for and represent them in a Grate and General Court to be Convened Held and kept for the Government Service at the State House in Boston on Wednesday the 26th Day of May instant, at Nine of the Clock in the Morning and so on from Day to Day through their Session and Sessions as Directed in the Precept sent to Said Town
- 2^d To Choose a Moderator and Consider of and Determine whether they Chuse at this time, Have a new Constitution or forme of Government Made, and if so whether they will impower their Representative for the next year to vote for the Calling a State Convention for the sole purpose of forming a New Constitution, according to the Directions of the House of Representatives Dated Feb^y 19th 1779
- 3^d To See if the Town will allow the accounts of the Selectmen for providing for the families of the Continantal Soldiers belonging to this Town since last October and Grant Money to pay the Same, and Order the Assessors to Make it into a Rate forthwith
- 4th To See if the Town will Choose som suitable persons in addition to the Committee that was Chosen last March Meeting, to provide Necessaries for the families of the Continantal Soldiers belonging to this Town, according to the Resolves of the General Court
- 5th To See if the Town will make an additional Grant of Money to provide Necessaries for the families of the Continantal Soldiers belonging to this Town, and Order the Assessors to Make it into a Rate forthwith, and impower the Committee appointed to provide Said Necessaries to Draw the Money for that purpose from the Treasury
- 6th To See if the Town will build a New School House in the Southwest Quarter of the Town, agreeable to the Petition of M^r David How and Others
- 7th To See if the Town will Grant Money and Choose a Committee to hire the Men to be Detached from the Militia of this Town (By Order of the Council of this State) to March to Fivertown in the State of Rhode-Island, and Order the Assessors to to Mate Said Money into a Rate forthwith By Order of the Selectmen
