This notification has been posted up at each Meeting House in Sudbury agreeable to the vote of said Town By Order of the Selectmen
The Town by their vote accepted of the warning of this meeting James Thompson Town Clerk

At a Legall Town Meeting in Sudbury July 12th 1779 The Town being met at time and place according to the foregoing warnings proceeded and chose Capt. Hon^{le} Rice Moderator. Then the Town voted to pass over the first article and to keep the 2^d article. Voted that this Town highly approves of the measures taken by the Merchants and other the Inhabitants of the Town of Boston in Order to reduce the Exorbitant prices of the Necessaries of Life Consequently to appreciate our Currency. That this Town will adopt such reasonable Measures as may be agreed upon by the Joint Committees from the Several Towns in this State in Order to answer such valuable Ends

3 Voted to Empower their Committee Chosen for the purpose of hiring Soldiers for the public Service when ever there may be a Call for the same to hire the men that are or may be called for on the best terms they can and to Lay their accounts before the Town for allowance and payment

Then the Town by their vote Adjourned this Meeting to Monday the 26 Day of July instant at three o'Clock after noon to meet at the East Meeting House in Sudbury

Monday July 26 The Town being met at time and place according to the above Adjournment proceeded and chose Maj^r Joseph Curtis their Delegate agreeable to the Recommendation of the General Court Referred to in this article and voted to instruct him to serve the Selectmen of this Town with a printed Copy of the form of a Constitution they may agree upon in Convention

Then the Town Adjourned this Meeting to Monday the 2 Day of August next at three o'Clock after noon at the same place

Monday the 2 of August 1779 The Town being met according to Adjournment proceeded and dismissed Maj^r Joseph Curtis from serving their Delegate as above mentioned he being unwilling to serve

3 Then the Town took up the third article again and granted the sum of nine Hundred and thirty six Pounds in addition to the 3900 pounds granted at a former Town meeting to enable their Committee to hire the men for the nine months Service Then the Town by their vote Dissolved this Meeting

These are to notify and warn all the Freeholders and other Inhabitants of and belonging to Sudbury Qualified as the Law directs to vote in Town affairs and all other male Inhabitants of said Town being Twenty-one years of age and free to meet at the west Meeting House in Sudbury on Monday the ninth Day of August Instant at three o'Clock after noon on that Day then and there 1779

1st To Choose a Moderator and see if the Town approves of the Resolves of the Convention at Concord on the fourteenth of July last, and Transact any thing Relating to said Resolves that the Town may think proper when met

2^d To see if the Town will Choose a Committee to State the Prices within this Town of Inholders Laborers Farming Manufactures and all other articles not taken up by the Convention at Concord above Mentioned
