The Town by their vote accepted of the warning of this Meeting.

At a Town Meeting in Sudbury Legally warned September 20th 1779
The Town being met at time and place according to the foregoing warning proceeded and Chose Capt Asahel Wheeler Moderator: and proceeded to the work of the Day and Chose the following Gentlemen a Committee to attend the General Court to hear the Report of the Committee appointed by the General Court on the Petition of a number of Inhabitants of this Town Living on the East Side of Sudbury River viz Thomas Plympton Esq^r Col^l Ezekiel How and William Rice Jun^r And voted to Give their Representative the following Instructions viz

To Capt Jonathan Rice
Notwithstanding a former vote of this Town, for dividing the Same by the River yet, upon more maturely considering the Situation, and viewing the Circumstances of the Town, we are fully of Opinion that a Division of the Same Cannot take place without Prejudice to the one part or the other. You are therefore directed to use your utmost Endeavours to prevent any Division of Said Town
Then The Town by their vote Dissolved this Meeting
