At a Legal Town Meeting in Sudbury Octo^r 13th 1779

The Town being met according to the above warning proceeded and Chose
Capt Jonathan Rice Moderator then the Town proceeded to the work of the
Day and took the 2 article under Consideration and

2 Voted that This Town will Give to Each man that ^{will} voluntarily enlist
a Soldier agreeable to the Resolve of the Great and General Court of
this State Dated the Nineth of Octo^r Instant So much ^{per} month as will
make his monthly pay (with what he will receive from this State and
the Continent) Fifty Pounds

Voted that Each man that voluntarily Enlist for the Service aforesaid
shall receive one Hundred Dollars Down as advance pay

Voted to Empower the Militia officers of Each Company in this Town
to Borrow Said Money on the Towns Credit and Give Security in behalf of
the Town

Then the Town by their vote Dissolved this meeting

These are to Notify and warn all the freeholders and Other Inhabitants
of and belonging to Sudbury Qualified as the Law directs to vote in Town affairs
to meet at the East Meeting House in Sudbury on Monday the Eighth Day of
November next at one of the Clock afternoon on S^d Day then and there

- 1st To Choose a Moderator, and bring in Town debts and Credit
- 2^d To see if the Town will Grant to their Rev^d Ministers their Salary for
the year Ensuing, and if they will Grant them an Honourable Grat-
uity for the Ensuing Year
- 3^d To see if the Town will Grant money for the Support of a Grammar
School, and Order where Said School shall be kept the Ensuing year
- 4th To see if the Town will Grant money for the Support of a Reading and
writing School, and Order where S^d School shall be kept the Ensuing year
- 5th To see if the Town will Grant Money for the Relief of the Poor in Said
Town the Ensuing Year
- 6th To see if the Town will appoint men to take Care of and Sweep Each of
the Meeting Houses in S^d Town, and to Dig Graves as there may be
occasion the Ensuing Year
- 7th To see if the Town will Grant Money to pay the Assessors and Town Treas-
urer the present year
- 8th To see if the Town will Grant Money to pay the Money that has been Borrowed
on the Towns Credit by their Committee, to hire the Men for the last three
months Service at New-York; And to pay the Select men the Money that they
have advanced to Said use by Order of the General Court
