

+ These are to notify and warn all the Freeholders and other Inhabitants of and belonging to Sudbury Qualified as the Law directs to vote in Town affairs ~~to meet at the~~ and in the Choice of Representatives, and all other Inhabitants of Said Town being Twenty-one years of Age and free: to meet at the Meeting House in Sudbury on Tuesday the ninth Day of May instant, at one of the Clock afternoon on Said Day then and there

- 1st To hear and take under Consideration the Constitution, agreed upon by a Late Convention of Delegates from the Several Towns in this State, Chosen for the Sole purpose of framing a new Constitution; and propose amendments therein, or accept of Reject the whole. And to Choose a new Delegate to meet in Said Convention at the Adjournment at Boston on the first Wednesday of June next: if the Town shall think proper. And to see if the Town will Impower their Delegate to agree ^{up} on a time when the Constitution shall take place
- 2^d To see if the Town Elect and Depute one or more persons being Freeholders and Resident in Said Town, to serve for and Represent them in a Great and General Court or Assembly to be Convened held and kept for the Government's Service at the State House in Boston upon ~~the first~~ ^{the thirty first} Wednesday of May instant, at nine of the Clock in the Morning and So de Die in Diem During their Session or Sessions agreeable to the precept sent to this Town
- 3^d To Choose any or all Such Town officers that the Town may Judge necessary by Reason of this Town's being Divided
- 4th To see if the Town will make a Reasonable Gratuity to their Rev^d Minister for the Last half of the present year: And Order the Assessors to make it into a Rate forthwith
- 5th To see if the Town will Grant a Sum of Money, to provide Necessaries for the Families of the Soldiers belonging to this Town Engaged in the Service of the United States During the war. And order the assessors to make it into a Rate forthwith

This Notification has been posted up at the Meeting House in Said Town agreeable to the vote of Said Town by order of the Select men James Thompson Town Clerk the Town by their vote accepted of the warning of this meeting

At a Legall Town Meeting in Sudbury May the 9th 1780

The Town being Met at time and place according to the foregoing warning proceeded to take the Constitution under Consideration and the Constitution being Read it was Moved and voted to Leave the Constitution for Consideration to the Adjournment of this Meeting

- 2^d Then the Town proceeded and Chose Colⁿ Ezekiel How to serve for and Represent them at a Great and General Court to be Convened held and kept for the Government's Service at the State House in Boston on Wednesday the 31st Day of May instant at nine of the Clock in the Morning and So de Die in Diem through their Session and Sessions as Directed in the Precept sent to Said Town

But he not inclining to serve, the Town made Choice of Capt Jonathan Rice to serve for and Represent them in the Great and General Court before Mentioned Then the Town Chose Capt Jon^a Rice Moderator and by their vote Adjourned this Meeting
