(in the South ward) Qualified as the Law directs to vote in Town affairs to meet
at time and place as within Directed After Cutler
The Town accepted of Mr Cutler's Return
The Return of Constable Haynes was according to Law and was accepted by
the Town

At a Legall Town Meeting in Sudbury June 15th 1780

The Town being met at time and place according to the foregoing warning
they Chose Cap^t Asahel Wheeler Moderator then the Town passed over to the
3^d article and Chose Tho^s Plympton Esq^r Mr After Cutler and Mr Tho^s Walker a
Committee to Repair to the Rev^d Mr Biglow and Report to the Town what will
Satisfy him as his Salary. Then the Town proceeded to the 2^d article

1 Voted to Choose ~~Sixteen~~ a Committee of Sixteen men to hire the men
to be raised in this Town in consequence of a Resolve of the Great and
General Court of this State of the fifth instant viz^t The Commissions of
Officers of each of the Companies of Militia the Selectmen, the Committee of
Correspondance &c and Mr John Maynard Mr Sam^l Puffer Mr Isaac Puffer
Cap^t Sam^l Knight Cap^t Moses Stone Tho^s Plympton and L^{td} James Puffer
and Voted to Empower said Com^{tee} to hire Sixteen men to Reinforce the
Continental army for Six months on the Best terms they Can and Report
to the Town at the Adjournment of this Meeting
and also voted to Empower said Com^{tee} to Borrow the money ^{to hire 16 men} and Give securi-
ty therefor in behalf of the Town and Oblige themselves in behalf of the Town
to Make up the Depreciation of the Money if any shall be

3 Then the Town took up the 3^d article again and appropriated the fifteen
Hundred Pounds Granted at a former Town meeting as a Gratuity to the Rev^d Mr
Jacob Biglow for the Last half of the present year, to the use of hiring the
Sixteen men before mentioned
And Granted to the Rev^d Mr Jacob Biglow as a Gratuity for the Last half of
the present year Thirty Seven Pounds to be paid in Silver money at Six
Shillings & Eight pence p^r Ounce or Rye at four Shillings or Indian Corn at
three Shillings p^r Bushel and Ordered the Assessors to make said Sum into
a Rate forthwith

Then the Town Adjourned this Meeting to Thursday the 22^d Day of June instant
at two of the Clock after noon at the same place

Thursday June 22 the Town being met again according to Adjournment proceeded
to the third article and Granted the Sum of Thirty Thousand Pounds toward Enabli-
ng their Com^{tee} to fulfill their Engagements in behalf of the Town with the
Sixteen men Required of this Town to Reinforce the Continental army said
Committee to be accountable to the Town for the same and Ordered the Assessors
to Make a Sum into a Rate forthwith
Then the Town by their vote Dissolved this Meeting
