2 Granted the sum of Seventy four Pounds to Enable their Com^{tee} to settle with Abraham Goodnow Silas Tower Micah Goodnow Jr Joel Parmenter and Reuben Moore who did the two months service at Rhode Island the last year

Also Granted the sum of one Thousand one Hundred and Eight Pounds to Enable their Committee to settle with James Dalrymple one of the last nine months men to Reinforce the Continental army

3 Appointed Mr Asper Cutler in addition to the Com^{tee} mentioned in this article

4th Ordered the Assessors to make all the Money Granted at this meeting into a Rate forthwith Then the Town by their vote Dissolved this meeting

Ist These order you to warn all the Freeholders and other Inhabitants of and belong^{ing} to Sudbury (in your ward) Qualified as the Law Directs to vote in Town affairs and as is Directed in the Constitution or forme of Government of the Common wealth of Massachusetts for the Choice of a Governor a Lieut Governor Councillors and Senators, to Meet at the Meeting House in said Town on Monday the fourth Day of September next at two of the Clock afternoon on said Day then & there

To bring in their Votes for a Governor, a Lieut Governor and Councillors & Senators agreeable to the Rules and Directions in the Constitution or forme of Government of the Common wealth of Massachusetts

And make due Return of this order with your doings thereon to the Selectmen or Town Clerk at time and place above mentioned
