There are to notify and warn all the Freeholders and other Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury Qualified as the Law directs to Vote in Town Affairs and all such as are Qualified according to the Constitution or Form of Government of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to Vote for a Representative to meet at the Meeting House in Sudbury on Monday the fourteenth day of May Inst at 2 o'clock P. Meridien on said day then & there
1 To elect and depute some Person being a Freeholder and Resident in said Town to serve for and represent said Town in a Great and General Court Appointed to be Convened held & kept for the Government's service at the State House in Boston on Wednesday the thirtieth day of May Current agreeable to a Law of the Commonwealth in that Case made and provided —

2 To Choose a Moderator and see if the Town will Assent of and Confirm the Division of property belonging to, and Debts due from the former Town of Sudbury, between the now two Towns of Sudbury and East Sudbury agreeable to an Act of the General Court for Incorporating the Town of East Sudbury, which Division is then to be exhibited by the Committee appointed by the Town for that purpose or do or act as the Town shall think proper when met —

3 To see if the Town will Grant money for the Support of the poor belonging to said Town —

4 To see if the Town will Grant money to pay the Debts contracted in Years past by their Committee for the purpose of hiring men to recruit and reinforce the Army and Order the money so granted to be made into a Note forthwith or do or act as the Town shall think proper when met

5 To see if the Town will give Instructions relative to the Support of Mary the Wid^d of Samuel Goodenows late of Sudbury
