- 15 To see if the Town will take any further measures in addition to those already taken, in order to Complement their Quota of Men for three years or during the War; or otherways make provisions for relieving those who are now engaged for six months do or act as they shall think proper when met
- 16 To see if the Town will take such further measures, as to them shall appear best, in order to disburthen themselves of the Wid^d Piper and Children
- 17 To see if the Town will Grant a suitable sum of Money to purchase a Town stock of Ammunition as required by the Militia Act; and provide or Appoint some place proper to deposit the same and order the Money Granted at this Meeting to be made into a Note forthwith: By Order of the Selectmen

2 Granted to the Reverend Mr Jacob Biglow for his salary the ensuing year seventy four pound in specie

3 Granted for the support of a Grammar school the year ensuing twelve pound & ordered said school to be kept at the school House near the meeting House

4 Granted for the support of a reading & writing school the year ensuing forty-eight pound and ordered the same to be kept in the other four school Houses in equal proportion
