These are to notify and warn all the male Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury Qualified as is provided by the Constitution to Vote in the Choice of a Governor, Lt Governor and Senators, and all others Qualified as the Law directs to Vote in Town Affairs to meet at the Meeting House ~~in Sudbury~~ in ~~the~~ Town on Monday ~~the~~ 1st Day of April next at 1 o'clock after noon then & there.

1st To give their Votes for a Governor Lt Governor, Counsellors and Senators for the Year ensuing as directed and provided for by the Constitution - - - - -

2 To choose a Moderator and see if the Town will accept of and confirm the Agreement of the Committee chosen by Sudbury and East Sudbury to make a Division of all whatever is to be divided between the two Towns of Sudbury and East Sudbury agreeable to an Act of the General Court for incorporating the Town of East Sudbury - - - - -

3 To see if the Town will hear and accept the Report of their Committee appointed at their last March Meeting to view a Town road running through the Lands of Messrs Benj^m & Jonathan Smith do or act as the Town shall think proper when met - - - - -

4 To see if the Town will order how the paper money of the new Impression now in their Treasury shall be disposed of - - - - -
