These are to Notify and warn all the male Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury Qualified as is provided by the Constitution, to Vote in the Choice of a Governor, Lieut Governor, and Senators; and all others Qualified as the Law directs to Vote in Town affairs, to meet at the Meeting House in sd Town on Monday the seventh Day of April next at 1 o Clock after noon on sd Day then & there

- 1 To give in their Votes for a Governor, Lt Governor Councillors & Senators for the Year ensuing as ~~directed~~ directed and provided for by the Constitution
- 2 To Choose a Moderator, and see if the Town will will order their Treasurer to receive of the following Constables Viz: Mess^{rs} Josiah Richardson, Joshua Haynes, Howard Bogle and Caleb Moulton, or of either them, the paper Money now in their hands, said to have been raised for Taxes committed to sd Constables to Collect; do or act as the Town shall think proper when met
- 3 To see if the Town will choose a Committee to join with a Committee that shall be chosen by the Town of Sudbury for the purpose of selling the Land commonly called Pratt's place, and empower sd Committee to give a title of the same; do or act as the Town shall think proper when met
