3 Article The Town Voted to Choose a Committee for the purpose as expressed in this Article, and appointed the Selectmen said Committee and empowered them in Conjunction with such Committee as shall be appointed by the Town of East Sudbury for the purpose above said, to sel. & give a Title, in behalf of the Town, of the Land referred to in this Article --

Then the Town took up the 2^d Article again and ordered their Treasurer to sell the ^{of the new Imposition} Paper money, that may receive of the above said Constables at the Rate of three Dollars for one Dollar in specie

Then the Town by their Vote dissolved this Meeting
