These are to Notify and warn all the Male Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury Qualified as is provided by the Constitution to Vote in the Choice of a Governor, Lieut Governor and Senators, all others Qualified as the Law directs to Vote in Town affairs to meet at the Meeting House in said Town on Monday the 5th Day of April next at 2 of the Clock after-noon on 5th Day then & there

- 1 To give in their Votes for a Governor, Lieut Governor & ^{Counsellors} Senators for the Year ensuing as directed and provided for by the Constitution
- 2 To Choose a Moderator and see if the Town agreeable to the Request of Mr Jedediah Farmer and others will lengthen out the Time (ordered by said Town at their last Meeting in March Inst) for calling in the whole or any part of the Debts due to said Town
- 3 To see if the Town will order their Treasurer to receive of Mr Josiah Richardson one of the former Constables, the Ballance due from him, to said Town, in Bills of Credit, or any Part of it, do or act as they shall think proper when met
- 4 To see if the Town agreeable to the Request of Mr John Maynard will order their Committee to erect a Place at the School House near the Meeting House for hanging the Bell on instead of repairing the Place where it now hangs
- 5 To see if the Town will order Interest to be paid to Ruben Moore on his Obligation given by the Treasurer in behalf of D^d Town for his intisting himself into the service for the term of three years
