Then the Town took up the 2^d Article again and allowed Capt Moulton till the next annual meeting in May to settle with the Treasurer in. Also allowed Mr Richardson the same term of time to settle with the Treasurer in. Then the Town granted the same Indulgence to all other Constables who have not settled with the Treasurer as granted to the two above mentioned

5 Article The Town by their Vote ordered Interest to be paid to Reuben Moore as requested in this Article
Then the Town by their Vote dissolved this meeting
