These are to Notify and Warn all the Male Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury Qualified as is provided by the Constitution to Vote in the Choice of a Governor Lieut Governor and Senators and all others who are Qualified as the Law directs to Vote in Town affairs to Meet at the Meeting house in Sudbury on Monday the 4th Day of April next at 2 of the Clock in the after noon then & there

1 To bring in their Votes for a Governor Lieut Governor Counsellors and Senators for the Year ensuing as directed and provided for by the Constitution and

2 To Choose a Moderator and see if the Town will take measures in order to free themselves from the Expence of Supporting Joseph Miller's Wife and Children sent from the Town of Marlborough do or act as the Town shall think proper when met
