To Mr Benjamin Smith one of the Con-
stables of the Town of Sudbury - Greeting

You are hereby required to warn all the
Freeholders & other Inhabitants, in your ward,
belonging to the Town of Sudbury, Qualified as
the Law directs to Vote in Town Affairs, to
Meet at the Meeting House in sd Town on
Thursday y^e 22^d day of September Instant at
3 of the Clock in the afternoon on sd day then
and there

To Choose a Moderator and see if the Town
will make provision for the Reception, Inter-
tainment & Payment of the General Courts
Committee now soon to come into Town for
the purpose of viewing the Causeways & Bridges
lying between the Towns of Sudbury and East
Sudbury agreeable to the petition of the Agents
of said Sudbury

Also Choose an Agent or Agents, with proper
Instructions, to wait upon said Committee in
behalf of said Town, do or act as the Town shall
think proper when met

And make due Return of this Warrant with
your doings therein unto the Selectmen of said
Sudbury at time & place aforesaid
