Then the Committee appointed on the 4<sup>th</sup> Article reported  
which Report was accepted and ordered to be recorded as follows

Viz. According to the Vote of the Town, we have proposed  
the following Plan: Viz. The two Front Seats, & the  
1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>d</sup> Seats on each side, shall move first: Then, the  
next two Front Seats, & the 3<sup>d</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> on the sides, shall  
move in the second place: & thirdly, the hind seats.

Then the Town by their Vote Dissolved this meeting.

These are to notify and warn all the Freeholders  
and other Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury  
who are Qualified as the Law directs to Vote in Town  
Affairs, to Meet at the Meeting House in said  
Town on Monday the 21<sup>st</sup> day of August Instant  
at 4 of the Clock in the Afternoon on said Day  
at then and there

1 To choose a Moderator and see if the Town will  
appoint some suitable person or persons to  
Represent them in in a County Convention to  
be held at Concord in order to consult on public  
Grievances agreeable to the request of one John  
Nutting do or act as the Town shall think  
proper when met

2 To see if the Town will order their Treasurer to  
recall a Warrant of Distress by him issued against  
Capt Caleb Moulton of Frammingham a former  
Constable of the Town of Sudbury or take any other  
measures in order to compromise the Difference  
between them said Town and said Moulton as the Town  
shall think proper when met
