- 7th Art^{le} Granted for the support of a Grammar School the ensuing year Forty Pounds & ordered the same to be kept in rotation in the several school houses in said Town 5 weeks at a time ——— 40
- 8th Art^{le} passed in the negative ———
- 9th Art^{le} Granted of the poor the ensuing year Thirty Pounds ——— 30
- 10th Art^{le} Granted to pay the Apes for the present year Four pounds ——— 4
- 11th Art^{le} To pay the Treasurer Three pounds ——— 3
- Allowed To ^{appointed} Joseph Johnson for purpose mentioned in this article To St Hopertel Brown for 60 feet of plank & casting the same nine shillings & two pence for two pair of Army stockings 1778 twelve shillings 1 — 1 2
- 6th Art^{le} Taken up again & agreed to Discharge said Richardson from the Ballance referred to in this Article he paying Two pounds seventeen shillings & all Costs for which sum of £2-17-0 said Richardson by the Consent of the Town, gave a note payable to the Treasurer
- Demanded Constable Sam^l Puffer for Abel Maynard's pole Tax 1781 Sixty seven shillings & 10^d £3-7-10
- Allowed To Capt^l Habel Wheeler for preambulating the line between Sudbury & East Sudbury three shillings ——— 3
- To Tho^s Walker for one day at blowing Rocks & powder five shillings; for going for a Surveyor to run the line round the Ministerial Land two shillings ——— 7
- To the Selectmen for expenses in running the Ministerial lines three shillings each ——— 9

Then the Town Adjourned this meeting to the Exchanging House of Aaron Johnson Innholder in said Sudbury. The Town being met according to the foregoing Adjournment, proceeded & chose Messrs Whammar, Rice Tho^s Walker & Capt^l Sam^l Puffer a Committee to examine the Accounts of Est^{le} Rice, who report that, from the proceeds of the Estate of the wid^d Putman, Surplusage of Money Granted to purchase the Town Standard of Weights and Measures & Money received of the Town of Bolton there is a Ballance due from
