These are to Notify and Warn all the Freeholders and other Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury who are Qualified as the Law directs to Vote in Town Affairs to meet at the Meeting House in said Town on Monday the 8th day of January next at 1 of the Clock in the After noon on said day then and there

- 1st To choose a Moderator and Attend to an Address from the Honourable General Court to the People of this Commonwealth then and there to be read agreeable to the Order of said Court —
- 2 To see if the Town will Grant money to purchase Ammunition to supply the deficiency in their Stock required by law —
- 3 To see if the Town agreeable to the request of Mr Aaron Johnson will make an Additional Grant for the relief of the Poor in said Town —

The Town by their Vote Accepted the warning of this meeting

January 8th 1787 The Town being met according to the foregoing warning proceeded and chose Col Johna Rice their Moderator. Then said town attended to the reading of the Address referred to in this Article

2 Then the town Granted Ten Pounds to purchase Ammunition as set forth in this Article £ 10-0-0

3 Then the Town Granted the sum of Ten pounds for the relief of the poor as expressed in this Article 10-0-0

Then the Town Ordered the money Granted at this meeting to be made into a rate forthwith

Then the Town by their Vote dissolved this meeting
