These, are to Notify, and Warn, all the Freeholders, and other Inhabitants, of the Town of Sudbury, who are Qualified, as the Law directs, to Vote in Town Affairs, to meet, at the Meeting House, in said Town, on Monday the 5th Day of March next, at 1 O'Clock, in the Afternoon, on said Day; then & there

- 1st To choose a Moderator, Selectmen, Town-Clerk, Town Treasurer, Assessors, Constables, and all other Town Officers, required by Law, to be Annually chosen, in the Month of March. —
- 2^d To see, if the Town, will repair their High-ways, by a Rate, the present Year, & grant a suitable Sum of Money, for repairing the same, do or Act, any other Way, on this Article, as the Town, shall think proper. —
- 3^d To see, if the Town, will give Liberty, for Swine, to go at Large, the present Year. —
- 4th To see, if the Town, will give Liberty, for Horses, to go at Large, without Fetters, any Part of the present Year, from the first Day of April next, to the last Day of September next. —
- 5th To see, if the Town, will give Liberty, for Sheep, to go at Large, from the fifteenth Day of March, to the first Day of May next. —
- 6th To see, if the Town, will accept of the Settlement, of the Selectmen, with the Town Treasurer, and order the same to be recorded. —
- 7th To see, if the Town, by their Vote, will desire the Selectmen to open the Town Meetings, in future, at the Time appointed in the Warning: — Also, to see, if the Town, by their Vote, will order, that in future, no Vote, shall be passed, in Town Meeting, but by Day-light, (agreeable to the Petition, of James Mosman, and others) do, or Act, as the Town shall think proper. —
