Then the Town, by their Vote, Adjourned, L. S. L.
this Meeting: to One Fortnight, from
this Day 1 Clock, afternoon, - then
to meet, at the same place.

Saturday Monday Novemb^r 10th 1788.

The Town, being Mett. agreeable to the foregoing
Adjournment, proceeded to an Attention
of the latter Clause in the 2^d Article: - But
after some Desultory Debate: on the
matter: - they then Voted, to adjourn
this Meeting: for the space of One Hour.

Then the Town, again Assumed
this Meeting: - agreeable to the fore-
going Adjournment. - And

Taxes, for 1784. State Tax 12/8 - for the
Town Tax - 8/8

For Jonas Underwoods, Taxes, the same year,

For William Moores, Taxes the same year,
State Tax 12/8 - Town Tax 8/8

For Daniel Jones, Taxes the same year,
State Tax 3/2 - Town Tax 2/3

For Isaac Moores, Town Tax, for the
year 1789 - 6/5

Atf. The State Taxes, above mentioned, to be
allow'd to S^d Cutler, at the Rate, he pur-
chased Certificates, when he Settled,
with the State Treasurer.

Allow'd William Hayden, for Nathan Read
Taxes, Two Pounds, eleven Shillings, & 4^d

Allow'd Luther Goodenow, for transporting
two Loads of Stones, to the Canal Bridge
Six Shillings - Also, for transporting
Four Loads of Gravel, - Two Shillings
and Eight pence.

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
