lution, proceeded to bring in their Votes, for a
Federal Representative.

For William Hull Esq^r ~ 12 Votes.

Then the Town, by Vote Dissolved this Meeting.

Meet at the Meeting House, in sd Town, on Monday, the
16th Day, of this Instant February, at 3 o'clock

choose some persons, or persons, to appear in Behalf
the Inhabitants, of sd Town, before Samuel Phillips Esq^r
& 19th at his Dwelling House, in Weyton, on the 2^d day
of March Next, 10 o'clock forenoon, there to answer
Calib Moulton, of East Sudbury, & Confession
name, if they see Cause, of the Demand stated against
them, as may appear, by a Copy of sd Writting
Do, or At, &c
