Then Mr. Elisha How, came into
open Town Meeting, & forthwith
Declared, his Non Acceptance, to
the Office of Constable.

Then the Town, chose Mr. Isaac
Lincoln, a Constable for the South

Ward, the year ensuing.

Then the Town, by Vote caused Mr. Isaac Lincoln
from serving, Constable, the year ensuing.

Then Mr. Isaac Maynard, came into open Town
Meeting, and Declared his Acceptance, to the Office of
Constable. - Said Maynard, has since been sworn
into Office, by the Clerk, of said Town.

Then the Town, chose Mr. Isaac Lincoln
as a Constable, for the South Ward the year ensuing. -
Mr. Lincoln, has since taken the Oath of a Collector, before the Town Clerk.

Then Voted, to take up, the 14th Article.
Then Voted, to pass over, the 14th Article for the foreword.
And Voted to take up, the 15th Article, which Committee
being called upon, Reported, that they had met, the
Selectmen of East Sudbury; - Capt. Moulton being present,
and further, that the Action, between Mr. Moulton &
the Town, is dropped.

Then Voted to choose a Committee, to meet East-
Sudbury Committee, on Friday, next, and further
to examine into the Matter, relative to Moulton's
Action; - A Committee, to consist of three, & Capt.
Isaiah Wheeler, Mr. Thomas Walter, and Mr. Daniel
Thompson, were chosen.

Then the Town, empowered their Committee to call upon
all those Persons, who were concerned in hiring Men, for
the Town in the course of the late War, and ordered said
Committee, to report a State of Facts, at April Meeting.
