

April Anno Domini 1789.

At a Legal Town Meeting held in Sudbury, on Monday the 6th Day of April 1789

The Town proceeded, as in the 1st Article, to the Choice of a Governor. Viz^t

For his Excellency John Hancock 47 Votes.

For the Hon^{ble} James Bowdoin Esq^r 7 Votes.

For his Honor Benjamin Lincoln Esq^r 2 Votes.

Votes for Lt Governor.

Viz^t For his Honor, Benjamin Lincoln Esq^r 38 Votes.

For Hon^{ble} Samuel Adams Esq^r 10 Votes.

Then proceeded, to the Choice of Senators.

Viz^t For Hon^{ble} Nathaniel Gorham. 40 Votes.

For Hon^{ble} Eleazer Brooks. 28 Votes.

Hon^{ble} Joseph B. Varnum. 40 Votes.

Hon^{ble} Isaac Stearns. 29 Votes.

Hon^{ble} Ebenezer Bridge. 32 Votes.

Hon^{ble} Joseph Horner. 10 Votes.

Joseph Curtis Esq^r 11 Votes.

Hon^{ble} James Prescott 4 Votes.

Hon^{ble} Abraham Fuller. 3 Votes.

John Brooks Esq^r 3 Votes.

Ephraim Wood Esq^r 1 Vote.

William Price Esq^r 1 Vote.

Capt Lawson Buckminster. 1 Vote.

John Stone Esq^r 1 Vote.

2^d Article. chose Col^l Jonathan Price, Moderator.

The Question was then asked, to see, if the Town, would proceed to the Choice of a Comtable, in the Person, of Isaac Lincoln Jun^r it pass'd in the Negative.

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3^d Article. Then the Town proceeded to the 3^d Article, and pass'd by the Town's Vote, in the Negative.

4th Article. Then the Town attended to the Report, of their Committee, refer'd to in this Article. Who Reported, that the Committee of Selectmen, who drew the Money, from M^r Treasurer Thompson, had sufficiently Accounted for the Same; As appear'd by examining their Receipts; & that the Balance, between the Town, and s^d Committee, was supposed, to be even.
