There are to Notify and Warn, all the Freeholders, & other Inhabitants, of the Town of Sudbury, Qualified according to the Constitution to Vote, in the Choice of a Representative; and those Qualified as the Law Directs, to Vote, in Town Affairs, to Meet at the Meeting House, in s^d Town, on Monday the 11th Day of May next, at 2^o Clock, Afternoon, on s^d Day:— Then and there

Article To elect, or Depute some Suitable Person, being a Freeholder, & Resident in s^d Town, to serve for, & Represent s^d Town, in a Great & General Court, appointed to be Conven^d, held, & kept, for the Service of this Commonwealth, at the State House, in Boston, on Wednesday the 26th Day of May Next: Agreeable to a Law of this Commonwealth, in that Case, made & provided.

To choose a Moderator, & see, if the Town will accept, a Person, to serve as a Constable or Collector, in the Room of Isaac Lincoln Jun^r Or otherwise, to choose a Constable, in his stead. DO or Act &c

To see, if the Town, will give Liberty for Messrs Benjⁿ Smith, Jonathan Smith, & L^t Peter Smith to work out their Highway Rates, or any part of s^d Rates, on the Road that leads, thro^o the s^d Peter Smith's land, to Smith's Mill in Stow. DO or Act &c

To see if the Town, will take Measures, for enclosing the Burying Yard, in a Decent Manner. DO or Act &c

To hear the Reports of the Committies, chosen at sth April Meeting.

To see, if the Town, will, Agreeable to the Request of David Maynard, Abate his Rates, in Future. DO or Act &c
