

May Anno Domini 1789.

At a Legal Town Meeting, held in Sudbury on Monday the 11th Day of May 1789.

The Town proceeded to the Business of the Day: And Voted to send a Representative.

Then the Question was put, to see if the Town would establish the Pay, of their Representative, and it passed in the Negative.

Article 1st Then proceeded to the Choice of a Representative, and chose William Price Esq^r a Freeholder & Resident in sd Town: to serve for & represent sd Town in the GENERAL COURT, the Year ensuing.

2nd Then proceeded to the 2nd Article, & chose Col^l Jonathan Price, Moderator. Then passed over the remainder of this Article, for the present.

3rd The Request, as contain'd in this Article, was Negativ'd by the Town's Vote.

Again took up the 3rd Article, And the Question was put, to see, if the Town would Abate Mr Benj^a Smith, & Lt Peter Smith's, Highway Rate, the present Year, in consequence of their working out the same on the Road, leading thro' Lt Peter Smith's land, to Smith's Mill in Stow: And it pass'd in the Affirmative.

Then took up the Remainder of the 2nd Article And the Question being put, to see, if the Town would Accept William Lincoln, as a Collector of Taxes, the ensuing Year: in stead of his Father, Isaac Lincoln, and it pass'd in the Negative.

Then Voted, to proceed to the Choice of a Constable for the South Ward, the Year ensuing: & Mr Elisha Goodenow, was chosen to sd Office.

4th Then the Town Voted, to choose a Committee of Three Persons, for the purpose of Decently enclosing the Burrying Yard: Said Committee consisted of Mr Isaac Maynard, Capt Asahel Wheeler, and Lt James Puffer. Then instructed sd Committee, to cause an Addition, to sd Yard, if attainable: And further to report an Estimate of Costs, at October Meeting.

230 5th The Town Accepted the Report of the Committee chosen to Agree with William Parkman, & others, proprietors of Meadow Lots, Near or On Haynes's Island, & Ordered the same to be Recorded.

6th Article, Unanimously pass'd in the Negative.
