

May Anno Domini 1789.

Then the Question was Asked, to see if the Town, would Abate Mr David Maynard's State Taxes, in future, and it pass'd, in the Negative.

Then the Town Voted an Abatement of the sd David Maynard's Highway Rates in future.

Then Voted to Adjourn this Meeting One Fortnight from this Day, 5 O'Clock, in the Afternoon, then to meet at the same place. Sudbury Monday the 23rd of May 1789.

The Town being Met agreeable to the foregoing Adjournment, proceeded to the Choice of a Constable, for the South Ward, the present Year, when it appeared, by a Return of Votes, that Mr Dornic Woodward Moore, was chosen to the said Office.

Then Voted, to Adjourn, this Meeting to Wednesday, the 3^d Day of June, 5 O'Clock, in the Afternoon, then to meet at the same place. Sudbury Wednesday 3^d of June 1789.

The Town, being Met, agreeable to the foregoing Adjournment, & proceeded, and by Vote, Directed their Treasurer, to proceed, with all those persons, who have been chosen by the Town, as Constables, for the South Ward, the present Year, - in form & Manner, as the Law directs: unless he is able to procure a Collector, from the Number so chosen.

Then the Town by Vote, Dissolved this Meeting.
