Then the Town, Voted, that their Committee, wait upon Mr Doane, & request of him, the price of the Land, he would sell the Town, as an addition to the Burying Yard. - of make report to the Town.

4th Article, pass'd over, for the present.

5th Article, pass'd in the Negative.

6th The Question, was, Asked, to see if the Town would take any Order on this Article, and it pass'd in the Negative.

7th Article - Voted that this Article rest for the present.

Then Discounted, to Constable Sam^l Brown, the sum, of One Pound, fourteen Shillings, and eleven pence in specie, for Sam^l Hunt's Rates, for the Year 1788. - £ 1. 14. 11.

Also, Isaac Moores Rates, the same year, being seventeen Shillings, & ten pence. - 17/10

Also, Daniel Wait's Rates, the same year, being seventeen Shillings, & ten pence. - 17/10

Also, Daniel Jones, Rates, the same year, being four Shillings, & one penny. - 4/1

Also, Eliphaz Child's Rates, the same year, being thirteen Shillings, & four pence. - 13/4

Also, Joseph Dorris Rates, the same year, being thirteen Shillings, & four pence. - 13/4

- Then Allow'd, to Thomas Carr, for Stones, to cover a Bridge, four Shillings. - " 4 "

- To, Elisha How, for Timber, and Nails, for Lammum Bridge, six Shillings. - " 6 "

- To, Thomas Walther, for Removing Thebe Verry, to East Sudbury, three Shillings. - " 3 "

Then Voted, to Adjourn, this Meeting.

Then, the Town, by Vote, reconsidered the Vote, for adjourning.

Then attended to the Committee's Report, relative to Hannah Johnson; - who Reported, that the Dispute, between this Town, & the Town of Needham, As to the Support of the said Hannah Johnson and Children; - is finally compromised & ended. - which may more fully appear, by certain Papers, Ordered, to be, and now are filed in the Clerks, Office.
