

October Anno Domini 1789 - L. v. 2.

Then the Town again took up the 7th Article and Voted, that William Price Esq^r. be Directed, to work out, the Delinquency of his High-Way Rates, on the Long Causing, - Pathforth: - Or such a part, of s^d Delinquency, as he may suppose, the publick good, immediately requires.

Then Voted to Adjourn this Meeting, for one Fortnight, - 1 Clock, Afternoon, then to meet at the same place.

— Sunday Monday Nov^r 9th 1789.

The Town, being Mett, agreeable, to the foregoing Adjournment, - proceeded to the

8th Article - And Voted Interest, on the Remainder of the Obligation, refer'd to, in this Article, from February last: - And Authoris'd the Treasurer, to take up, the Original: - and Give his Obligation, in Behalf of the Town, in lieu thereof: - provided the s^d Brigham will wait for the Principal, untill September next.

9th Article, pass'd in the Negative.

10th Article - Appropriated the Remainder of the Money, mentioned in this Article, to the Use, of a Reading & Writing School: - to be kept out, at the School House - near the Meeting House.

— Then Allow'd, to Joseph How, for One Hundred & thirty feet of Plank: - Seven Shillings.

Also, for Mending, a Set of Drill Irons, One Shilling and six pence.

— To Caleb Brown, for Eighty feet, of Two Inch & half, white Oak plank, Ten Shillings.

— To John Brown, for Two Hundred & sixty nine feet, of Three Inch white Oak plank, One Pound, Seventeen Shillings & eight pence.

Also, for Eighty nine feet of Two Inch ditto, Eight Shillings.

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Then Voted, to take up the 4th Article & And also Voted, to choose a Committee of five Persons, for the Purpose of examining into the State or Condition, of the Meeting House. And make report at the Adjournment, of this Meeting: - s^d Committee were, M^r James Thompson, Cap^t Goodenow, M^r Isaac Maynard, M^r Samuel Jones, and Col^l How.
