Allowed to Mr James Thompson, for six half Days
in Attending a Committee in East Sudbury, for settling
the Affair, between the Two Towns - time &
expenses. 12/- " 12 "

- To Deaⁿ Thomas Walter, for six half Days
in Attending a Committee, in East Sudbury, for
settling the Affair of Moulton, between the Two
Towns, - time and expenses. 12/- " 12 "

- To, Cap^t Sabel Wheeler, for seven half Days,
in Attending a Committee in East Sudbury, for
settling the Affair of Moulton, between the Two
Towns, time and expenses. 15/- " 15 "

- To, Isaac Maynard, for One Day perambulating
the Line, between Sudbury & Concord,
in April last. 3/- " 3 "

Then Voted to hear the Report of the Committee re-
lative to the Burying Yard: - who reported, that
they had disowned Mr Doane, - as to, the purchase
of a piece of Land, in addition to the v^d Yard. And
that he, the v^d Doane, - would dispose of a piece
at the Rate of Twenty-four p^{er} Acre.

Then Voted, that the Inhabitants, of the Town
should presently - go out, & inspect the Land proposed
as an Addition to the Burying Yard: who accordingly
went out.

The Inhabitants, returned and affirmed
the Meeting.

The Question, was then Asked, to see, if
the Town, would purchase the Land, of Mr
Doane, at the Price proposed, and it passed
in the Negative.

Then Voted, that the Selectmen, be directed
to draw a Line, round the Burying Yard, where the
New wall is, to be erected.

The Question, was then Asked, to see if the
Town, would accept of the Land, proposed to be
purchased of Mr Doane as an Addition to the
Burying Yard, provided it be free of expense
to the Town in General - And it passed in the
Affirmative.
