

Meeting of the Town of 1789. L. 1. 2.

Then Voted, that the selectmen be empowered, to stake out the ground, round the Burying Yard, including that, in Addition; - And contract for the building a Wall, round the same: - Provided the additional land, be procured by Subscription.

While

11th Then provided, to the 11th Article; - & Granted the sum of Forty pounds, for the support of a Grammar School, the year ensuing. 40 " "

12th Then provided, to the 12th Article, & Granted the sum of Fifteen pounds, for the support of a Reading & Writing School, the year ensuing. 15 " "

Then Voted, that the above Grants, for Schooling, be equally divided, between the 5 Squadrons, in the Town.

13th Then provided, to the 13th Article, & Granted the sum of Fifty pounds, for the Relief of the Poor, in S. Town, the year ensuing. 50 " "

14th Granted, to pay the Assessors, four pounds. 4 " "

Granted to pay the Treasurer, three pounds. 3 " "

15th Voted that Mr. Hezekiah Johnson, have the sum of fifteen shillings, for taking care of the Meeting House, ringing the Bell &c the year ensuing; which he accepted. 15/-

Then Discounted Constable Peter Haggins & Daniel Wait from Tax - being seven shilling and three pence. 7/3

Then Discounted Constable Cutler Joseph Moores Oath, for 1789 - being fourteen shillings, & six pence. 14/6

Then Discounted Constable John Goodenow the W^{id} Sarah Willis Oath, being four shillings, & eleven pence. 4/11

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Then Granted, the sum of Twenty pounds for the purpose, of enabling the Treasurer to discharge the Remainder of an Obligation, originally for £ 30 - Against the Town; Now in the hands of Warren Prigiam, of Marlborough. 20
