To Vote, in Town Affairs: To Meet, at the Meeting-
House, in s^d Town, on Monday, the 10th Day of May,
next, at 2 O'clock, Afternoon, on s^d Day, then & there,

Article 1st // To elect, or Depute, some suitable Person,
being a Freeholder, and Resident, in s^d Town, to
serve for, and Represent s^d Town, in a great, and
general Court, Appointed to be conven'd, held, and
kept, for the Service of this Commonwealth, At
the State House, in Boston, on Wednesday the 20th
Day, of May next, Agreeable to a Law, of the Common-
wealth, in that Case, made & provided.

To choose, a Moderator, and see, if the Town, will also,
choose a Constable or Collector, for Compleating the Col-
lections, on the Assessments, formerly Committed to
Capt^t Augustus Moore, Or Do or Act, any other Way
on this Article, as the Town, may think proper when
Met.

To see, if the Town, will choose a Committee
for taking Advice, respecting any Person, or Persons,
that may be brought, to the Town, of Sudbury, for
support: Or Do or Act, as the Town may think
proper, when Met.
