

October Anno Domini 1790

Sudbury Monday 8th November, 1790 — The Town
being met, agreeable to the foregoing adjournment,
proceeded to the 5th Article, and Voted to choose, a
Committee of Three persons, for the purpose of consulting
5th — the Committee, of East Sudbury, on the propriety
of a Lottery, for raising the Causeways, called the Long
and Short Causeways, in S^d Town, — And Dea^m Walker,
Cap^t Goodenow, and Esq^r Price, were chosen: — And
ordered to report at a future Meeting.

8th — Passed in the Negative.

— The Committee mentioned in the 4th Article
reported, that in the Opinion of S^d Committee, it would
promote the Towns Interest, to sell the Said House, and
erect a New one, in S^d District.

— The Committee mentioned in the 3^d Article re-
ported, that they had viewed the Wall, round the Burying
yard, and that the same might be rebuilt or new
one erected, for Seven Shillings p^r Rod. And like-
wise, that an Addition, to S^d Yard, might be obtained.

— The Committee's Report, relative to the School House
was not accepted by the Town.

— Then Voted to choose a Committee, for the purpose
of letting out, the Removal, of the School House, in the
North east Ward, and to repair the same & also, to deter-
mine the place, to which the S^d House shall be removed,
Committee chosen, were, Cap^t Holden, L^t Elijah Briggs,
— and L^t Hopetill Willis.

— Then Ordered their Committee to enclose the Land, at the
East end of the Burying yard, which appears to be the Town's: — &
also on the North Side, and Annex the same to S^d Yard.

— Then Voted to Grant, the sum of Nine pounds,
for enabling their Committee, to Build the Wall,
round the Burying yard.

— Then Voted to Dissolve this Meeting.
