— Then proceeded to the choice of a County Register,
Viz^t For William Winthrop Esq^m — 38 Votes. —

— Then proceeded, to the choice of a County Treasurer,
Viz^t For Hon^{ble} Ebenezer Bridge — 44 Votes. —

Then Voted that M^r John Goodenow's Allowance
at October Meeting, be Deducted, from the Balance
due the Town, from William Price Esq^m a former Treas^r. —

Then Voted, that the further Consideration of Constable
for the North Ward, be put off, for the present. —

7th Article, Then Voted, to empower the Committee
or either Two of them, to sell the remainder of the Land
refer'd to, in this Article: — and also, to transact all
the other Matters, contain'd in a petition, sign'd by
Peter Haynes, & others; and Ordered the petition, to be
recorded: — which is as follows. —

To the Selectmen, of said Town, Gentlemen

These are to desire You, to insert it, as an Article
in the Warning of the next Town Meeting, to see, if
the Town, will choose a Man, or men, to join their
former Committee, to sell Samaster Old Road, or
30 Rod, Highway so called, which the Lth of M^r
Benjamin, Wight, and John Moore, were bound
on, in the West tier, of the New Grant Lots, & empower
them, or either two of them, to sell the remainder of the
Land, which remains unsold; & give a Title, in behalf of
the Town: — Also, empower them, to prosecute or eject, any
person, or persons, that has, or shall cut, or carry off, any
wood or Timber, from sd Highway: — Do or act, as the Town
shall think proper, when met. — Indorsed Feb^y 21st 1791
