8<sup>th</sup> Article, Voted to waive this Article for the present.

9<sup>th</sup> Article, Voted to choose an Agent, to answer to a Memorial, signed by John Richardson Esq. of Concord, against the Town of Sudbury, - & William Price Esq. was chosen, & empowered, to appear, in Behalf, of S<sup>d</sup> Town, agreeable to the Tenour, of s<sup>d</sup> Memorial.

10<sup>th</sup> Article, Then Instructed, the Committee refer'd to in this Article, to conduct, s<sup>d</sup> Affair, in a Discretionary manner, or in such a channel, as they shall think most conducive to the Town's interest.

Then Voted, that the 6<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup> & 13<sup>th</sup> Articles, in the Warning of this Meeting, be put over to April Meeting, for further Consideration.

Then Voted to Dissolve this Meeting.

These are to Notify and Warn, all the Male Inhabitants, of the Town of Sudbury, Qualified as is provided in the Constitution of this Commonwealth, to Vote, in the choice of a Governor, Lt Governor, and Senators, for the Year ensuing; - and all Others, Qualified as the Law direct, to Vote, in Town Affairs, to meet at the Meeting House, in S<sup>d</sup> Town, on Monday the 4<sup>th</sup> Day of April Next, at 1 Clock afternoon, on s<sup>d</sup> Day: then and there.

1<sup>st</sup> To bring in their Votes, for a Governor, Lt Governor, and Senators, for the Year ensuing.
