= Then Voted to put over the 13th Article, in the warning of March Meeting, to the Annual May Meeting: - then to be acted upon.

= 3^d Praised to the choice of Fish Wardens, of those Mess^{rs} Joseph Moore, Wiah Gibbs, Jeremiah Robbins, and Abel Willis, to the Office aforesaid.

= 6th Then took up the 6th Article, and Voted, that the Persons, chosen, as Constables, the present Year, have the Privilege of serving as Collectors of Taxes only. ~~Mr. William Oliver Esq^r & Mr. Daniel Osborn have since~~
sworn, to the Office, of Collectors, before the Clerk of S^d Town.
= Then chose Deacon of Thomas Walker as Constable for the Year ensuing. S^d Walker has since been sworn, into Office, by the Clerk, of S^d Town.

= 4th Then Directed the Committee, refer'd to in this Article; - to join with East Sudbury, in applying for a Lottery, to raise the Long & Short, Causeways in S^d Town: - & if not obtain'd, - to petition for Relief, in some other way.

= 5th Then instructed the Committee, refer'd to in this Article, to erect the New Wall, at the east end, of the Burying Yard: - as near as possible, to the Line, on which the old Wall, formerly stood.

= 7th Article, Refer'd to May Meeting, for further Consideration.
